

Preparing your phone

Overview



Assembly

Before you can use your phone you need to:

- · Insert the SIM card.
- · Charge the battery.

The SIM card

When you register as a subscriber with a network operator, you get a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card. SIM cards provide the services necessary to use your phone.


Battery

Your phone comes with a built-in lithium battery, which is not removable. It is not charged when you purchase your T65. See "SIM card and battery" on page 7.

Network services

This symbol denotes services or functions that are supplied by your network operator. Some menus depend upon these services, so shortcut numbers to menus and functions may vary as a result. This phone supports all the services and functions described in this user's guide.

Getting started



SIM card and battery

- 1. Slide open the SIM card holder at the top of the phone.
- 2. Insert (or remove) the SIM card from the holder.
- 3. Slide the holder back into the phone.
- Connect the charger to the phone (the flash symbol on the plug must face upwards) and the mains. The indicator on top of the phone shows a steady light.
- 5. It may take up to 30 minutes before the display shows any indication, and then:



- the battery meter in the display pulses continuously.
- Optimized charging is shown briefly.
- 6. Charge your battery for 4 hours the first time.
- 7. Disconnect the charger by tilting the plug up.

Making calls

Before you can make and receive calls you must turn on your phone and be within range of a network.

Turning your phone on

- Press and hold **NO** until you hear a tone.

If you enter your PIN code incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked. To unblock it you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key). Your PUK is provided by your network operator.

Turning your phone off

In standby mode, press and hold \mathbf{NO} until you hear a tone.

Note: You will not hear a tone if silent mode is on.

Network search

After you have turned on the phone (and entered your PIN), the phone searches for a network. When a network is found, the phone switches to "standby mode". You can now make and receive calls.


Making a call

- 1. Enter the area code and phone number.
- 2. Press yes.
- 3. Press No to end the call.

Call list

The numbers that you have dialled are saved in the Call list

The call list saves:



The last 30 incoming and outgoing calls are saved together in chronological order.

To call a number from the call list

- 1. Press **YES** from standby mode.
- 2. Press or until the number you want to call is highlighted.
- 3. Press YES.

To clear the call list

- 1. Press vuntil you reach the *Call info* menu.
- 2. Press vuntil the *Options* submenu is highlighted, press **YES**.
- 3. Press until the *Clear call list* submenu is highlighted, press **YES**.
- 4. The question Call list clear? appears. Press YES.

Automatic re-dialling

If the connection failed when you first called, the display shows *Retry?*. Press **YES** to re-dial. Available with voice calls only.

Making international calls

- 1. Press and hold the $\mathbf{0}$ key until $\mathbf{a} + \text{sign appears}$.
- 2. Enter the country code, area code (without the leading zero) and phone number.
- 3. Press YES.

Making emergency calls

 Enter the international emergency number 112 and press YES.

Your phone supports the international emergency numbers, 112, 911 and 08. These can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with

or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.

Note: Some network operators may require that a SIM card is inserted, and in some cases that the PIN has been entered as well.

Local emergency numbers

To view your local emergency numbers

- 1. Press to go to the *Phone book* menu.
- Press until Special numbers is highlighted, press YES.
- Press until SOS numbers is highlighted, press YES.

Showing and hiding your number You can show or hide your number for a particular call.



To hide or show your phone number

- 1. Enter the phone number you wish to call.
- 2. Press until you reach the *Call info* menu, **YES**.
- 3. Press until *Next call* is highlighted, **YES**.
- 4. Press until *Hide my number* or *Show my number* is highlighted, **YES**.

Receiving and answering a call

When you receive a call, the phone rings and the display shows *Answer?*. Press **YES**.

Rejecting a call

- Press No.
- Press a volume key twice quickly. The display shows *Busy tone*. If the *When busy* divert function is on, the call is diverted to the number you have specified. See "Diverting calls" on page 42.

Missed calls

If you have missed a call, the message *Missed calls*: appears.

- 1. Press **YES** to display the missed calls.
- 2. Press **YES** to call the number.

During a call

Earpiece volume

During a call you can change the earpiece volume with the up and down volume keys.

Microphone

During a call you can turn off the microphone.

- Press and hold c until *Muted* appears in the display.
- Press and hold again to resume the conversation.


Note pad

If you want to make a note of a phone number during a call, you can use your phone display as a notepad. Information entered on the screen remains until deleted or the phone is switched off. It is possible to turn off tone signals when entering information.

To turn the tone signals on or off

- 1. Press to go to the *Ongoing call* menu, YES.
- 2. Press until *Turn off ton*es or *Turn on tones* is highlighted, **YES**.

Depending on whether a call is ongoing or not, either the *Call info* menu or the *Ongoing call* menu is shown.

Note: Many menu alternatives depend on your network subscription.

Display menus

There are seven main menus, each has several submenus. You enter the menus by pressing or • Use • or • or the volume keys to move up and down through the submenus and lists.

Moving through the menus

There are two ways of moving through the menus:

- · Scrolling by using the keys.
- · Using shortcuts.

Press...

Scrolling by using the keys to...

enter and move through the main menus enter and move through submenus or lists select a menu, submenu or setting YES NO go back one level in the menus or leave a setting unchanged. press and hold **NO** to go back to standby

Tip: When in the menus, instead of pressing the keys repeatedly to reach the submenu that you want, you can press and hold the arrow keys or press and hold the volume keys.

Using shortcuts

A quicker way to move through the menus is to use the shortcuts. First press () or () to enter the menus, then simply enter the number of the menu to which you want to go. To return to standby, press and hold NO

Menu language

To change the menu language

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Language, YES, Menus, YES.
- 2. Select a language and press yes.

To select a language that you want to use when writing text, see "Language" on page 18.

My shortcuts

You can place your favourite functions that you want to reach quickly and easily in the My shortcuts menu.

To select your settings for the shortcuts menu

- 1. Scroll to My shortcuts, YES, Edit shortcuts, YES.
- 2. Select a function from the list by pressing (*4).
- 3. Enter the position number that you want for this function in the menu. YES.

To add another function repeat steps 2 and 3. To remove a function repeat steps 1 and 2.

Press yes to exit the list.

When you buy your phone, the menu *My shortcuts* contains a few settings which you can remove if you wish

Tip: Press and hold from standby to reach the shortcut saved in the first position in My shortcuts.

Personalizing your phone

Your phone has been designed for easy personalization.

Sound settings

- Set the ring volume.
- · Set an increasing ring.
- · Set the vibrating alert.
- Set a specific ring signal for a caller.
- Select an existing ring signal.
- · Compose a melody.
- · Receive a melody.
- Set the key sound.

With all the above:

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Sounds & alerts, YES.
- 2. Respond to the simple requests or follow the easy instructions shown in the display.

Composing your own ring signal

You can compose eight different ring signals.

To compose or edit a ring signal

- 1. Scroll to *Settings*, **YES**, *Sounds & alerts*, **YES**, *My Melodies*, **YES**.
- 2. Select one of the melodies and press YES.
- 3. Press © to remove notes.
- 4. Use the keypad to enter notes:
 - Press and hold a key to enter a long note.
 - Press o to raise the note one octave.
 - Press # once to raise the note one semitone.
 - Press # twice to lower the note one semitone.
- To listen to your melody, press YES.
 Press YES again to save it or press NO to continue composing.

Pictures

Your phone comes with a number of pictures. Scroll to *Extras*, **YES**, *Pictures*, **YES**, where you can:

- Select a picture as background when in standby mode.
- Assign a picture to a contact in the phone book.
 When that person calls, the picture appears in the
 display (provided your subscription supports the
 Calling Line Identification service).

- Enclose a picture in a text message.
- · Edit a picture.

To draw your own picture

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Pictures, YES, My pictures, YES.
- 2. Press **YES** to start drawing with the picture editor.
- 3. Press **YES** twice to save the picture.

To edit a picture

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Pictures, YES.
- 2. Select a picture group and press **YES**.
- 3. Select a picture and press **YES** to start editing with the picture editor.
- 4. Press **YES** twice to save the picture. The picture is saved in *My pictures*.

Display settings

You can change the following display settings:

- Display light to automatic, off or on.
- Turn on the sleeping display to save power.
- Change the display's contrast.
- Change the text size and number of rows.
- User greeting.

With all the above:

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Display, YES.
- 2. Respond to the simple requests or follow the easy instructions shown in the display.

Greeting text

When you turn your phone on and off, a start-up and shutdown show appears in the display. You can also write your own greeting.

To write a new greeting

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Display, YES, User greeting,
- 2. Select *Custom* and press **YES**.
- 3. Write your new greeting.
- 4. Press **YES** to confirm your setting.

My numbers

My numbers shows your phone number(s). If your phone number cannot be retrieved from your SIM card, you can enter it yourself.

To enter your phone number

- Scroll to Phone book, YES, Special numbers, YES, My numbers, YES, Voice, YES.
- 2. Enter the number and press **YES**.

Time settings

You can change the following time settings:

- · Set the time and date.
- Set the time, date format.
- Set the time zone
- · Select auto time zone.

With all the above:

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Time and date, YES.
- 2. Select the setting you want to change, YES.

Entering letters

You can enter letters, for example, when you add names to the phone book, write text messages or enter WAP addresses.

Language

Before you start entering letters, you need to select the language that you want to use when writing.

To select a language

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Language, YES, Input, YES.
- 2. Scroll to the language that you want to use for entering letters and press *\(\phi\).
 - Repeat step 2 if you want to use another language.
- 3. Press yes to exit the menu.

When writing, you can switch to one of your selected input languages by pressing and holding #, and then selecting, *input language*.

Multitap text input

When saving names in the phone book or when writing WAP addresses, you enter letters using multitap text input. You press each key as many times as needed to show the letter you want.

In the following example, we will start writing a name in the phone book:

To enter letters using multitap text input

- 1. Scroll to *Phone book*, **YES**, *Add contact*, **YES**. Press **YES** again.
- 2. Press the appropriate key, 1 9, 0 c

 **, repeatedly until the character you want appears in the display. See the table of the Latin alphabet below:

Multitap example

- To enter an 'A', press 2 once.
- To enter a 'B', quickly press 2 twice.
- To shift between capital and lower-case letters, press (*4), then enter the letter.

T9™ Text Input

The T9TM Text Input method uses a built-in dictionary to recognize the most commonly used word for every sequence of key presses. This way, you press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key.

When you press the keys, different words are suggested. If the word you want is not suggested, you can edit the word. The word is then added to the dictionary so that it is suggested the next time you press those keys.

In the following example, we will start writing a text message:

To enter letters using T9™ Text Input

2. To write the word "Ericsson", press 3 7
4 2 7 7 6 6.
The word *Ericsson* appears.

3. If the word shown is the one you want,

• Press 1 to accept and add a space.

(To accept a word without adding a space, press 2)

If the word shown is not the one you want, press or repeatedly to view alternative words (candidates). Accept a word and add a space by pressing or .

If you do not find the word you want by pressing or .

• Press and hold # to go to a list of options.

· Select Edit word, YES.

•Delete the entire word by pressing \bigcirc , or delete one letter at a time by pressing \bigcirc and then \bigcirc repeatedly.

• Write the new word using multitap text input and press YES.

The word is added to the dictionary. The next time you enter (3), (7), (4), the word you just added to the dictionary will appear as one of the alternative words.

4. Continue writing your message. See "Sending text messages" on page 25.

Tip: Press and hold # when writing to enter a list of options for text input.

To turn the T9™ Text Input on or off

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Language, YES, T9 Input, YES.
- 2. Select On or Off.

Phone book

Your phone has a phone book, in which you can save information about your contacts. You can choose to have a reduced (*Short list*) phone book, which shows a contact's name, number and e-mail address, or an extended (*Full list*) phone book, which shows more detailed information.

To select the size of the phone book

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES.
- 2. Select Set list size, YES, select size, YES.

Contacts

To add a new contact

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Add contact, YES.
- 2. Press **YES** and enter a first name. Enter the rest of the details and confirm by pressing **YES**.
- 3. Scroll to Save and exit?, YES.

To call a contact

- 1. Scroll to *Phone book*, **YES**, *Call contact*, **YES**, or press and hold **r** from standby.
- Enter the first letter of the contact, YES. If the contact shown is not the one you want, scroll to the contact you want to call, YES.

- 3. If the default phone number of the contact is the number you want to call, press and hold YES. If you want to call another phone number, press YES to go to the contact. Scroll to the phone number you want to call.
- 4. Press yes to make the call.

You can find the contact by searching for either first or last name, depending on which sort order you have set.

To select a sort order

- Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES, Sort order, YES.
- 2. Select a sort order and press YES.

Shortcuts to contacts

From standby, press and hold one of the keys **2–9** to find a contact beginning with a letter on that particular key.

Shortcuts to phone numbers

From standby, you can find a phone number on the SIM card by:

• Entering its position number followed by #.

To see the position of the phone numbers that you have saved, go to *Phone book*, YES, *Options*, YES, *Position list*, YES.

Speed dialling

You can call the phone numbers that are saved in positions 1–9 on the SIM card.

 From standby, enter the position number and press YES.

To edit a contact

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Edit contact, YES.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YES.
- 3. Scroll to the contact that you want to edit, YES.
- 4. Scroll to the details that you want to edit, YES.
- 5. When you have made your changes, press **YES**. Scroll to *Save and exit?*, **YES**.

To delete a contact

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Edit contact, YES.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YES.
- 3. Scroll to the contact that you want to delete, YES.
- 4. Press \bigcirc , yes.

Organizing your phone book

You can organize your phone book so that the phone numbers you use most frequently are easily available.

To change position numbers

- Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES, Position list, YES.
- 2. Scroll to the phone number you want to move, press YES.
- Scroll to the position to which you want to move the phone number and press YES. The phone numbers switch positions.
- 4. When you have finished, press No.

A question appears. Press **YES** if you want to copy the changes to the SIM card.

Copy to and from the SIM card

Your contacts are saved in the phone. If you want to speed dial or if you want to use your contacts in another phone, you first need to copy the contacts to the SIM card. The contacts on the SIM card are then replaced by the contacts in the phone.

To copy all contacts to the SIM card

 Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES, Copy all to SIM, YES.

To copy all contacts to the phone

 Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES, Copy from SIM, YES.

To call a contact saved on the SIM card

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Call from SIM, YES.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YES.
- 3. Press yes to call the contact.

To check the status of your phone book memory

• Scroll to Phone book, YES, Memory status, YES.

Pictures, personal rings and voice commands

You can add a picture, personal ring signal and voice command to a contact.

To add an item to a contact

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Edit contact, YES.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact, YES.
- 3. When the contact is highlighted, press **YES**.
- 4. Choose *Edit name* or *Edit numbers*, press **YES**.

- 5. To add or modify a picture, scroll to *Picture*, **YES**. This takes you to *My Pictures*. Select a picture and press **YES**. See "Pictures" on page 16.
- 6. To add or modify a personal ring signal, scroll to *Personal rings*, **YES**. See "Sound settings" on page 15.
- 7. To add or modify a voice command, scroll to *Edit voice*, **YES**. See "Voice control" on page 38.

Groups

You can create groups of contacts to send messages to.

To create a new group

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Groups, YES.
- 2. Select Add group and press YES.
- 3. Enter a name for the group and press YES.
- 4. Scroll to Add member, YES.
- Enter the first letter of the contact you want to add, YES. Scroll to the contact you want to add, YES.
- 6. Select a number and press YES.
- To add the next member, scroll back to Add member and press YES.

Touch tone services

You can save a phone number together with tone signals and codes. When used, the number and all the

tone signals and codes are dialled automatically. This is useful when accessing an answering machine or when using telephone banking services.

To save a phone number with tone signals and codes

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Add contact, YES.
- Press YES and enter the name that you want to associate with the phone number and code. Press YES.
- 3. Enter the phone number. Press and hold *4 until the pause character p appears in the display. Enter the code, if needed, enter another pause, another code and so on. Press yes.
- 4. Scroll to Save and Exit?, YES.

Text and chat messages

You can use the Short Message Service (SMS) to send and receive text messages consisting of up to 160 characters. The number of characters can vary, depending on what services your network operator supports.

If the number to your service centre is not saved on your SIM card, you must specify the number yourself. Otherwise you cannot reply to received messages or send your own. This also applies to chat messages. See "Mobile chat" on page 27.

To check the service centre number

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, Options, YES, SMS, YES, Service centres, YES.
- If no number is found, select *Add new?* and press **YES**.
- Enter the number, including the international + sign and country code, and press YES.

Note: The number to your service centre is provided by your operator.

Sending a Text Message

 You can send a text message, and also insert pictures, melodies, sounds and animations in it. When you send messages containing such items, you use the Long messages function. See "Long messages" on page 26.

Sending text messages

For information about entering letters, see "Entering letters" on page 18.

To write and send a text message

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, SMS, YES, Write new, YES.
- 2. Write your message, YES.
- 3. Enter the recipient's phone number or press to retrieve a number or a group from the phone book.
- 4. Press **YES** to send the message.

Note: If you send a text message to a group, you are charged for each member of that group.

If you want to send the message later, press **NO** twice when you are asked to enter the phone number. The message is saved in the *Unsent* list in the *Message* menu.

To insert an item in a text message

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, SMS, YES, Write new, YES.
- 2. While writing your message, press .
- 3. Select *Insert object* and then select, *Picture*, *Sound*, *Melody* or *Animation*, **YES**.
- 4. Select an item, YES. Then press YES again to confirm.

Text formatting

You can change the style, size and alignment of the text, and create new paragraphs, in a text message.

To format the text in a text message

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, SMS, YES, Write new, YES.
- 2. Before you write the text message, press .
- 3. Select Text format, YES. Then select Text size, Text style, Alignment or New paragr., YES.
- 4. Select one of the alternatives, YES.

Receiving text messages

When you receive a text message, the phone beeps and the message *New message Read now?* appears.

 Press YES to read the text message, or No if you want to read the message later. The message is saved in Inbox.

- When you have read the text message, press YES to select one of the following options: Reply, Forward or Delete the text message.
- While reading the text message you can, for example, start a chat session with the sender or go to a WAP address found in the text message.
- Press No to close the text message.

To save an item in a text message When the e-mail address, phone number, WAP address, picture, animation or melody is highlighted, press YES. Then select to save the item and press YES.

- A picture or animation is saved in My Pictures.
- · A melody is saved in My melodies.
- An e-mail address or phone number is saved in Phone book.
- · A WAP address is saved in Bookmarks.

Long messages

A text message can contain up to 160 characters. You can send a longer message by linking two or more messages. Please note that you are charged for the number of linked messages.

To turn long messages on

• Scroll to Messages, YES, Options, YES, SMS, YES, Long messages, YES, On, YES.

Templates

If you have one or more messages that you send often, you can save these as templates. Your service provider may also have saved some templates in your phone.

To create a template

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, SMS, YES, Templates, YES, Add new?, YES.
- 2. Write the message, YES.
- 3. Press **YES** if you want to send the message now. Press **NO** to save the template.

Message options

You can set a default value for the message options below, or you can turn on the *Set on send* option which means that you choose the settings each time you send a message.

 Message type – The phone supports different types of messages. Your service provider may offer the facility of converting a text message into a format (e-mail or fax, for example) that suits the equipment that is going to receive the message.

- Validity period If your message cannot be delivered, for example, if the recipient has turned off the phone, your service centre can save the message to send it later.
- Request reply Include a reply request if you want the recipient of your message to reply.
- Status request Check if a message has been delivered.

To set a default message option

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, Options, YES, SMS, YES.
- 2. Select an option, YES.
- 3. Select Set default, YES.
- 4. Select an option from the list, YES.

To turn set on send on or off

• Repeat steps 1 and 2 above, then select *Set on send*, YES.

To request a status report

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, SMS, YES, Sent items, YES.
- 2. Select a message, press yes twice.
- 3. Select Status request, YES.

To check the status of a sent message

• Scroll to Messages, YES, SMS, YES, Sent items, YES, select a text message, YES, View status, YES.

Mobile chat

The mobile chat function works in the same way as a chat on the Internet.

To start a chat session

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, Chat, YES.
- 2. Enter the recipient's phone number, or retrieve it from the phone book.
- 3. Write your message, YES.

Receiving a chat session invitation When you receive a chat session invitation, the phone beeps and the message *Chat message Chat now?* appears.

- · To read the chat message, press YES.
- Write your chat message reply and press YES.
- To suspend a chat session, press NO.
- To resume a chat session, scroll to *Messages*, *Chat*, *Resume*.
- To end a chat session, press and hold NO.

- To reject a chat message, press **NO**. The rejected chat message is saved in *Inbox* in the *Messages* menu.
- If you receive a new chat message while another chat session is ongoing, press YES to end the ongoing session and start the new one.

Calendar

To add a new appointment

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Calendar, YES, Add appointm., YES.
- 2. Select the type of appointment, YES.
- 3. Press **YES** and enter a subject, location and description if required, **YES**.
- 4. Scroll to Continue?, YES.
- Scroll to and enter start date, time, end date, time (if required), YES.
- 6. Scroll to Continue?, YES.
- Select a reminder interval, for example 5 min before, YES.

Note: If you select Oth. reminder, enter a reminder date, **YES** and time, **YES**.

- 8. If the appointment is recurrent:
 - Select *Recurrent app*. from the options list, **YES**.
 - Select the recurrence you want, YES.
 - •If you want to set an end date, select Set end date, YES. Enter a date, YES.

If you want to change the class for your appointment:

- Select Class, YES.
- Select the class you want, YES.

If you want to set the time zone for a meeting:

- Select Time zone, YES.
- •Select a time zone, YES. Your meeting time will be adjusted automatically according to the time zone you are in.
- 9. Confirm with Save and exit?, YES.

To add a new task

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Calendar, YES, Add task, YES.
- Select a task, yes.

If you select phone call, enter a number, YES. If you select message, select a type of message, YES.

- Press YES and enter a subject. Scroll to Descr., YES and enter a description.
- 4. Scroll to Continue?, YES.
- 5. Confirm with Save and exit? from the options list, YES.

Note: If you want to set a reminder, scroll to Set reminder, **YES**. Enter a reminder date, **YES**.

Viewing your calendar

To view your calendar, scroll to *Extras*, **YES**, *Calendar*, **YES**.

In the monthly or weekly views, you can go to next by pressing — or go to next week quickly by

pressing 3, to next month by pressing 6 and to next year by pressing 9. You can go back by pressing c or go back quickly by pressing 1 for a week, 4 for a month or 7 for a year. To reach the current day, press c.

To edit or delete an appointment

- In the calendar, scroll to the day of the appointment you want to edit, YES, select the appointment, YES.
 If you want to delete the appointment, press C.
- 2. To edit, press **YES** again to open the appointment.
- 3. Press **YES** again to go to the list of options.
- 4. Select Edit this, YES.
- Proceed as described in "To add a new appointment" on page 28.
- 6. Confirm with Save and exit?, YES.

To edit or delete a task

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Calendar, YES, View all tasks, YES.
- 2. Scroll to the task you want to edit.

 If you want to delete the task, press C.
- 3. To edit, press YES again to open the task.
- 4. Press **YES** again to go to the list of options.
- 5. Select Edit this, YES.

- Proceed as described in "To add a new task" on page 29.
- 7. Confirm with Save and exit?, YES.

Calendar settings

To view your calendar options

- Scroll to Extras, YES, Calendar, YES, Options, YES, and then select one of the following:
 - Status. Check synchronization and available space.
 - Class view. View private or public calendar entries or both.
 - Reminders. Works even if the phone is off.
 - Profile switch. Switch to On, the question Switch profile? appears when, for example, a meeting is about to start. Press YES to view the list of profiles.

Synchronization

To synchronize the calendar and contacts in your phone with those in your PC, you need to install the synchronization program on your PC.

If you have an Internet calendar or phone book, you can also synchronize that with your phone calendar and contacts, using WAP.

Before you start the synchronization, decide which synchronization method you want to use:

- For synchronization with nearby devices, use the cable.
- For synchronization with your Internet calendar or phone book, use WAP.

To start the synchronization

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Synchronization, YES, Synchronize, YES.
- Select the synchronization method you want to use and press YES.

Synchronization Sound

You can select whether you want the phone to make a sound when the synchronization is finished.

To turn the synchronization sound on or off

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Synchronization, YES, Sound, YES.
- 2. Select On or Off and press YES.

To make the WAP synchronization settings

- Scroll to Extras, YES, Synchronization, YES, Server settings, YES.
- 2. Select WAP profile, YES.
- 3. Select Server userid, YES. Enter your user id.
- 4. Select Server pwd, YES. Enter your password.
- 5. Select Server URL, YES. Enter the Internet address.
- Select *Phone book path*, YES.
 Enter the Internet address, user id and password for your phone book on the Internet.
- Select Calendar path, YES.
 Enter the Internet address, user id and password for your calendar on the Internet.

Using mobile Internet

Your phone has a WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) browser and e-mail messaging which are designed to bring a modified Internet to your mobile phone. A wide range of services are available, for example, news, entertainment, timetables, reservations, banking, e-commerce, positioning and e-mail.

Before you start

To use the mobile Internet you need



- A phone subscription that supports data transmission.
 A correctly set data account for access to
- an Internet server.
- 3. A correctly set WAP profile for WAP browsing.
- Correctly set e-mail account settings for e-mail messaging.

Note: The settings may already be entered when you buy the phone, or you can receive the settings from your network operator or your service provider in a text message.

To request settings from Sony Ericsson Mobile Internet

- Use a PC to go to www.SonyEricssonMobile.com. By using the WAP and E-mail Configurator, you can request that a text message be sent to your phone with the settings you need.
- 2. When the message arrives, New settings. Install? appears:
 - Press YES to install the new settings or
 - Press **NO** to cancel installation. A new request for settings is then required, as in step 1.

Using WAP

To select a WAP profile

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, Select profile, YES.
- 2. Select a WAP profile, YES.

To start browsing

There are three different ways in which you can start browsing:

- Press and hold the access key to connect to your homepage from standby, or
- · Press the access key, select a bookmark, YES, or
- Scroll to WAP services, YES, Enter address, YES, Enter the WAP address, YES.

To exit the browser

- Press and hold No. Remain connected? appears.
 - •Disconnect completely, press NO.
 - •Leave the browser temporarily but stay connected, press the access key and select *Go to menu*.

Options When Browsing

When browsing, you can reach different browsing options such as links or special features by pressing the access key. The options may vary depending on the WAP page you are visiting.

To change the homepage of a WAP profile

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, WAP settings, YES.
- 2. Select the profile whose homepage you want to change, YES.
- 3. Scroll to Chg homepage, YES.
- 4. Enter the name of the homepage, YES.
- 5. Enter the address of the homepage, **YES**.

To work with your bookmarks when not browsing

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, Bookmarks, YES.
- 2. Select the bookmark you want to work with, YES.

- 3. Select one of the following submenus, YES:
 - Go to bookmark. Go to the marked WAP page.
 - Edit bookmark. Edit the name and/or the WAP address of the bookmark.
 - Delete. Delete the bookmark.
 - Send as link. This creates a text message in which the WAP address is sent as a link. You can add a comment if you wish.

To empty the cache memory

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, Clear cache, YES.
- 2. Empty cache? appears, YES.

Security

To establish secure connections when using certain WAP services, you need to have certificates saved in your phone. Your phone may already contain certificates when you buy it. You can also download certificates from certain WAP sites, or receive them from a service provider.

To turn on a secure connection

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, WAP settings, YES.
- 2. Select the profile you want to edit.

- 3. Select Gateway, YES, IP settings, YES, Security, YES.
- 4. Select On, YES.

To check the certificates in your phone

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, WAP settings, YES, Common, YES.
- Scroll to Security, YES, select Trusted certif. or Client certif., YES.

Locks (PIN codes)

PIN codes are used to protect your subscription from unauthorized use, when accessing certain WAP sites, and to authorize transactions. Your PIN code acts as a signature when you confirm a transaction.

Note: These codes are supplied by your network operator or service provider.

A *Locks* setting may appear in the Security sub menu.

To go to the Locks menu

 Scroll to WAP services, YES, WAP settings, YES, Common, YES, Security, YES, Locks, YES.

Transaction contracts

You can check which transactions you have made with your phone when browsing. Each time you confirm a transaction with your signature lock code, a record is saved in your phone. The contract contains details of the transaction.

To check your transaction records

 Scroll to WAP services, YES, WAP settings, YES, Common, YES, Security, YES, Contracts, YES.

WAP push messages

A service provider can send updated news or new WAP settings to your phone in a push message.

Accepting or rejecting push messages

If you do not want to receive push messages, you can turn off the Push access. This setting is valid for all your WAP profiles.

To turn the push access on or off

- 1. Scroll to WAP services, YES, WAP settings, YES, Common, YES, Push access, YES.
- 2. Select On or Off.

Receiving push messages

When you receive a push message, it comes to the *Push inbox*. You can respond to a push message as follows:

- *Postpone*. Saves the push message so that you can load and see it later.
- Load. The browser starts and loads the pushed WAP page.
- · Delete. Deletes the push message.

E-mail

You can use your phone to send and receive e-mail messages.

Note: You need a subscription that supports data transmission. For more information, consult your service provider.

Sending and receiving e-mail messages

The Send & Receive option offers the fastest way to send e-mail messages saved in the Outbox and check for new e-mail messages.

To write and send an e-mail message

- $1. \ Scroll \ to \ \textit{Messages}, \ \textbf{YES}, \ \textit{E-mail}, \ \textbf{YES}, \ \textit{Compose}, \ \textbf{YES}.$
- 2. Select:
 - To: then add name, enter an e-mail address, or retrieve an e-mail address from the phone book. You can also retrieve a saved address from received messages in your inbox.
 - Cc: if you want to send a copy of the message to someone.
 - Priority: Set the message priority.
 - Subject: Write a title, YES.
 - Text: Write your message, YES, select Continue, YES.
- 3. Select one of the following:
 - Send now: The e-mail message is sent.
 - Send now with attachment: You can attach a picture from "My pictures". Select a picture and press YES to send.
 - Save to outbox: The e-mail message is saved in the Outbox.
 - Save to drafts: The e-mail message is saved in Drafts.
 - When you select the Send & Receive option in the E-mail menu, all messages in the Outbox are sent.

To receive and read e-mail messages

- Scroll to Messages, YES, E-mail, YES, Send & Receive, YES.
- When the e-mail messages have been downloaded to the phone, go to the *Inbox* in the *E-mail* menu to read them.

To reply to an e-mail message

- 1. Open the e-mail message.
- 2. Place the cursor in the text and press YES.
- 3. Select Reply or Reply all, YES.
- 4. Select *New message* or to include the message you received, press **YES**.
- Write a message, YES.

To save an e-mail address or a phone number

- 1. When the e-mail address or phone number is highlighted, press **YES**.
- 2. Select Save. YES.

Archiving

You can archive an e-mail message in order to read it later, or if you want to save important information.

You can archive only as much text as the display shows.

To archive an e-mail message

- 1. Open the e-mail message.
- 2. Make sure that the text you want to archive is visible.
- 3. Place the cursor in the text and press **YES**.
 - Select *Copy to arch*, **YES**. The text can be found in *Archive* under the *E-mail* menu.

Profiles

A profile is a group of settings which suit a certain environment. Some phone accessories select a profile automatically. For example, when you place your phone in a car handsfree unit, the *In car* profile is chosen. There are seven pre-programmed profiles:

 Normal, Meeting, In Car, Outdoors, Port h-free (portable handsfree), Home and Office.
 If you select a profile other than Normal, an icon is shown in standby. See "Icons" on page 69.

A profile with no accessories associated with it, such as *Meeting* or *Normal*, must be chosen manually.

To select a profile

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Profiles, YES, Select profile, YES.
- 2. Select a profile and press YES.

Changing the profile settings

You cannot create more profiles, but you can change the settings for a profile.

To change a profile setting

- $1. \ Scroll \ to \ \textit{Settings}, \ \textbf{yes}, \ \textit{Profiles}, \ \textbf{yes}, \ \textit{Edit profile}, \ \textbf{yes}.$
- 2. Select a setting and press **YES**.
- 3. Change the profile setting according to your wishes. The settings remain until you change them again.

To change the name of a profile

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Profiles, YES, Edit profile, YES, Profile name, YES.
- 2. Enter a new name and press YES.

To reset the profile settings

 Scroll to Settings, YES, Profiles, YES, Reset profiles, YES.

Accessories

A specific profile is chosen automatically when you use the phone together with a certain accessory.

Adding accessories to a profile

You can add one or more accessories to any profile, except the *Normal* profile.

To add an accessory to a profile

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Profiles, YES, Edit profile, YES, Accessories, YES.
 Now you are in the list of the accessories already associated with the profile.
- 2. Select Add accessory? and press YES.
- 3. Select an accessory and press yes.

To remove an accessory from a profile

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Profiles, YES, Edit profile, YES, Accessories, YES.
- 2. Scroll to the accessory that you want to remove and press c. Press YES.

Voice control

With your phone, you can:

- Voice dial call someone by saying the name and number type.
- Answer and reject calls with your voice when using a handsfree kit.
- · Change profile with your voice.
- Activate the voice control by saying a "magic word".
 You can save up to 50 voice commands altogether.

To turn voice dialling on and record number types

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice settings, YES, Voice dialling, YES.
- 2. Select *On* and press **YES**.
- 3. Instructions appear. Press YES.
- 4. Select a number type and press YES.
- Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say the number type that you want to record. The voice command is played back to you.
- 6. Press **YES** to save the voice command. If the recording is not OK, press **NO** and repeat step 5.
 - You also need to record voice commands for each contact, that is the name, for example "John".

To record a contact name

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice commands, YES, Contacts, YES, Add voice, YES.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the contact name and press YES or press YES to display all contacts.
- 3. Select a contact and press **YES**.
- 4. Follow the instructions in the display.

Caller Name

You can choose whether you want to hear the recorded voice command for a name when you receive an incoming call.

To turn the caller name on or off

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice settings, YES, Caller name, YES.
- 2. Select On or Off.

Voice dialling

You can voice dial by saying the name of the person you want to call.

To make a call

 From standby, press and hold YES until you hear a tone. Release YES, lift the phone to your ear and say a name, for example "John". The name is played back to you.

If you have saved several numbers for that contact:
• After a second tone, say a number type that you

have recorded earlier, for example "home".

The number type is played back to you, and the call is connected.

From standby, you can also initiate voice dialling, voice profiles and voice control of voice memos by:

- · Pressing and holding the volume keys.
- Pressing and holding the handsfree button (when using a portable handsfree).
- Saying the magic word. See "The magic word" on page 40.

Voice answering

You can answer or reject incoming calls by using your voice, when using a portable handsfree or a car handsfree kit

To turn on voice answering and record voice answer commands

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice settings, YES, Voice answer, YES.
- 2. Press (*4) to select the accessories you want to able to use voice commands with.
- 3. Press YES to continue.
- 4. Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say "Answer", or another word, and press YES. If the recording was not OK, press NO and repeat step 4.
- Say "Busy", or another word. Press YES to save your recordings.

To answer or reject an incoming call using voice commands

- · When the phone rings, say "Answer".
- When the phone rings, say "Busy".

Changing profiles

You can also change profiles using your voice.

To turn on and record profile commands

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice settings, YES, Voice profiles, YES.
- 2. Select On and press YES.

- 3. Instructions appear. Press yes.
- 4. Select a profile and press YES.
- Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say the profile name. Repeat steps 4 and 5 to record voice commands for the other profiles.

To change a profile using voice commands

- 1. From standby, press and hold **YES** until you hear a tone.
- 2. Release YES, lift the phone to your ear and say the profile command for the required profile.

The magic word

You can record a magic word and use it as a voice command. Instead of pressing and holding YES, you say the magic word and then one of your recorded voice commands. The magic word is ideal when driving a car or when the phone is connected to a portable handsfree.

To turn on and record the magic word

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice settings, YES, Magic word, YES.
- 2. Select the accessories you want to be able to use with the magic word by pressing (*\(\alpha\)). Press YES.
- 3. Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say the magic word.

To re-record a voice command

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Voice control, YES, Voice commands, YES.
- 2. Select the type of voice command and press YES.
- 3. Select a voice command and press yes.
- Select Replace voice and press YES.
 To listen to a recorded voice command, select Play voice
- Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say the command.

You can also edit the voice command for a contact name in *Edit contact* in the *Phone book* menu.

Problems when recording

If problems arise, one of the following might have happened:

- You spoke too softly, too late, or too soon.
- You held the phone too far away hold it as you do during a call.
- The voice command was too short it should be around one second long.

Voice mail service

The answering service of your network allows callers to leave a voice message.

You can save the number of your voice mail service to be able to call your voice mail service by simply pressing and holding 1. The number is provided by your network operator.

To save your voice mail number

- 1. Scroll to Messages, YES, Options, YES, Voice mail no., YES.
- 2. Enter your voice mail number and press YES.

To call your voice mail service

- · Press and hold 1 from standby mode, or
- · Scroll to Messages, YES, Call voice mail, YES.

To change the message alert signal

- Scroll to Messages, YES, Options, YES, Message alert, YES.
- 2. Select a signal and press yes.

Diverting calls

You can use the *Divert calls* service to divert incoming calls to another phone number when you are unable to answer.

To turn on the divert calls function

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Divert calls, YES.
- 2. Select a call type and press YES.
- 3. Select a divert alternative and press YES.
- 4. Select Activate and press YES.
- Enter the phone number, including the area code, to which you want your calls to be diverted and then press YES.

To check the status of divert calls

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Divert calls, YES.
- 2. Select a call type and press YES.
- 3. Scroll to the divert you want to check and press YES.
- 4. Select Get status and press YES.

Fax and data calls

For fax and data calls, connect your phone to a PC and start the appropriate software program. If you have separate numbers for voice, fax and data calls, your phone will recognize the type of call.

To receive a fax or data call (separate numbers)

 Connect to a PC and answer from within the software program.

One number

If you have a SIM card that does not support separate fax and data numbers, the phone does not recognize the type of incoming call.

If you want to receive a fax or data call, you have to set the phone to one of these options. Once you have set your phone for a specific incoming call, it stays like this until you change it.

To set the next incoming call type

- 1. Scroll to Call Info, YES, Next Call, YES, Next Incoming, YES.
- 2. Select the call type you want and press YES.

More than one call

You can handle more than one call simultaneously.



Call waiting service

If the call waiting service is activated, you hear a beep if you receive another call during an ongoing call.

To turn on the call waiting service

• Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Call waiting, YES, Activate, YES. There may be a short delay before the network responds.

To make a second call

- 1. Put the ongoing call on hold by pressing YES.
- Enter the number you wish to call and press YES or press and hold to retrieve the number from your phone book.

To put the ongoing call on hold and answer the waiting call

Press YES to answer the waiting call.
 The ongoing call is now put on hold.

To continue the ongoing call and reject the waiting call

• Select *Busy* and press **YES**. The waiting call is rejected.

To end the ongoing call and answer the waiting call

· Select Release & answer and press YES.

Handling Two Calls

When you have one ongoing call and one call on hold, you can do one of the following:

To switch between the two calls

Press yes.

To end the ongoing call and return to the call on hold

- 1. Press No. The question Retrieve call? appears.
- 2. Press yes.

If you press NO, the call on hold is also ended.

To end both calls

Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Release all, YES.

To connect the two calls

• Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Transfer call, YES.



The two calls are now connected to each other, and you are disconnected from both. Please contact your network operator for charging details.

To join the two calls into a conference call

• Scroll to *Ongoing call*, YES, *Join calls*, YES. See "Conference calls" on page 44.

Receiving a third call

You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls unless you create a conference call.

To end the ongoing call and accept the waiting call

Select Release & answer and press YES.
 The waiting call becomes active and the call on hold remains on hold.

To reject the waiting call

• Select *Busy* and press **YES**. The caller hears a busy tone.

The third call is rejected.

Conference calls

In a conference call, you can have a joint conversation with up to four other people.



Creating a conference call

To create a conference call, you must have one ongoing call and one call on hold.

To join the two calls into a conference call

 \bullet Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Join calls, YES.

To add a new participant

- 1. Press YES to put the conference group on hold.
- 2. Call the next person you wish to include in the conference group.
- 3. Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Join calls, YES.

To extract a participant

- 1. Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Extract part, YES.
- Select the participant and press YES.You may now have a private conversation with the participant.

To rejoin the participant to the conference group

• Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Join calls, YES.

To release a participant

- 1. Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Release part, YES.
- 2. Select the participant and press YES.

To release all participants

• Scroll to Ongoing call, YES, Release all, YES.

To put the conference group on hold and make a new call

- 1. Press yes.
- 2. Enter the number you want to call and press YES.

To switch between the new call and the conference group

· Press yes.

To end the new call and return to the conference group

• Press NO and then YES.

To end the conference call

Press No.

Call time and call cost

To check the call time of the last call

• Scroll to Call info, YES, Call timers, YES, Last Call, YES.



You can also check the time of outgoing calls and the total call time.

To reset the total call time

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Call timers, YES, Reset timers, YES.
- 2. Select Total time or Outgoing time and press YES.

To check the cost of the last call

Scroll to Call info, YES, Call costs, YES, Last call, YES.

To check the total call cost

• Scroll to Call info, YES, Call costs, YES, Total cost, YES.

To reset the total call cost

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Call costs, YES, Clear total cost, YES.
- 2. Press yes to confirm your choice.

Setting the call cost

You can use the *Tariff* function to specify the price per call unit. The price entered is saved on your SIM card

To enter the price per call unit

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Call costs, YES, Set tariff, YES.
- 2. Enter your PIN2 and press yes.
- 3. Select Change tariff and press YES.
- 4. Enter the currency you want, for example GBP for Pounds Sterling, and press **YES**.
- 5. Enter the price per call unit, for example 0.75, and press YES. To enter a decimal point, press (*4).

To revert to call units

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES Call costs, YES, Set tariff, YES.
- 2. Enter your PIN2 and press YES.
- 3. Select *Units* and press YES.

Credit limit for calls

You can enter a total amount of money that can be used for making calls.

To set a specific credit limit

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Call costs, YES, Set credit, YES.
- 2. Enter your PIN2 and press YES.
- 3. Select Change credit and press YES.
- 4. Enter the amount, for example 30 pounds, and press YES.

To set unlimited credit

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Call costs, YES, Set credit, YES.
- 2. Enter your PIN2 and press YES.
- 3. Select *Unlimited* and press **YES**.

To turn the minute minder on or off

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Call timers, YES, Minute minder, YES.
- 2. Select *On* or *Off* and press **YES**.

Networks

Searching for networks

When you turn on the phone, it searches for the last accessed network. If this is not within range, you may be able to use another network.



To start an automatic network search

 Scroll to Settings, YES, Networks, YES, New search, YES.

To select a network

• Scroll to *Settings*, **YES**, *Networks*, **YES**, *Select network*, **YES**. Select a network and press **YES**.

Preferred Networks

You can create and edit a list that defines the order in which your phone selects a network during an automatic network search, when your home network is not within range.

To view the list of networks

 Scroll to Settings, YES, Networks, YES, Preferred nets, YES.

To add a network to the list

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Networks, YES, Preferred nets, YES, Add new?, YES.
- 2. Scroll to a network and press YES. If the network you want does not appear in the list, scroll to *Other* and press YES. Enter the three-digit country number and the two-digit network number and press YES. For details, please contact your network operator.
- 3. Enter a position number and press YES.

To rearrange the list

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Networks, YES, Preferred nets, YES.
- 2. Scroll to a network and press YES.
- 3. Select Change priority and press YES.
- 4. Enter the new position within the list and press **YES**.

To turn on the automatic or manual search mode

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Networks, YES, Search mode, YES.
- 2. Select Automatic or Manual, and press YES.

Security

You can protect your phone and subscription from unauthorized use in several ways.

Locking the SIM Card

The SIM card lock protects your subscription, but not your phone itself, from unauthorized use. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter your PIN every time you turn on your phone. If you enter your PIN incorrectly three times in a row, your SIM card is blocked. You need the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) which is supplied by your network operator to unblock it.

To unblock your SIM card

- 1. PIN blocked appears.
- 2. Enter your PUK (or PUK2) and press YES.
- 3. Enter a new four-to-eight-digit PIN (or PIN2) and press **YES**.
- 4. Re-enter the new PIN (or PIN2) to confirm and press YES.

Note: If you enter the wrong PUK ten times in a row, your card is permanently blocked. If this happens, you should contact your network operator.

To change your PIN

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Locks, YES, SIM lock, YES, Change PIN, YES.
- 2. Enter your old PIN and press YES.
- 3. Enter your new PIN and press YES.
- 4. Re-enter your new PIN to confirm and press YES.

To turn the SIM card lock on or off

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Locks, YES, SIM lock, YES, Protection, YES.
- 2. Select On or Off, enter your PIN and press YES.

Locking the phone

The phone lock protects the phone against unauthorized use if it is stolen and the SIM card is exchanged. You can change the phone lock code (0000) to any four-to-eight digit code.

Changing the phone lock code

 Scroll to Settings, YES, Locks, YES, Phone lock, YES, Change code, YES. Follow the steps described in "To change your PIN" on page 48.

To set the phone lock to on, automatic or off

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Locks, YES, Phone lock, YES, Protection, YES.
- 2. Select *On*, *Automatic* or *Off*. The current setting is not available in the list.
- 3. Enter the phone lock code and press YES.

Note: If you should forget your new code, you have to hand in your phone to your local Ericsson retailer or service point to have the phone unlocked.

Restricting calls

You can use the *Restrict calls* service to restrict certain types of calls.



To turn a call restriction on or off

- Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Restrict calls, YES.
- 2. Scroll to an option and press YES.
- 3. Select Activate or Cancel and press YES.
- 4. Enter your password and press YES.

Fixed dialling

The Fixed dialling function allows calls to be made only to certain numbers saved on the SIM card



Note: Emergency calls can still be made, even when Fixed dialling is on.

To turn fixed dialling on or off

- Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES, Fixed dialling, YES.
- 2. Enter your PIN2 and press YES.
- 3. Select On or Off and press YES.

To save fixed numbers

- Scroll to Phone book, YES, Special numbers, YES, Fixed numbers, YES, Add new?, YES.
- 2. Enter your PIN2 and press YES.
- 3. Enter the fixed number and press **YES**.
- Enter the name you want to associate with the number and press YES.

Closed user groups

The *Closed user group* function is another way of lowering call costs. On some networks it is cheaper to make calls within a call group. Your network operator can place certain numbers in groups. You can have a maximum of 10 groups.

To add a closed user group

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Closed groups, YES, Edit list, YES.
- 2. Scroll to Add new? and press YES.
- 3. Enter the name of the user group and press **YES**.
- Enter the index number of the group and press YES.
 The index numbers are provided by your network operator.

To activate a closed user group

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Closed groups, YES, Edit list, YES.
- 2. Scroll to the group you want and press YES.
- Select Activate and press YES.Calls can be made only within the selected user group.

To call outside closed user groups

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Closed groups, YES, Open calls, YES.
- 2. Select On and press YES.

Accepting calls

With the Accept calls service, you can choose to receive calls only from certain numbers. You have to save the numbers in an Accepted list. The phone numbers are saved in the Call list in the Call info menu.

To add numbers to the list of accepted callers

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Accept calls, YES, Edit list, YES, Add to list?, YES.
- 2. Select *Phone book*. Enter the first letter of the contact or group and press **YES**.
- 3. Scroll to the number or group you want to add, **YES**.

To set the accept options

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Call options, YES, Accept calls, YES, Accept options, YES.
- 2. Select an option, YES.

Code memo

You can save a maximum of 10 codes. Instead of having to remember all the security codes you use, you can save them in the code memo.

Checkword and security

To confirm that you have entered the correct password for the code memo and to prevent unauthorized access to your codes, you must enter a checkword. When you enter your password to open the code memo, the checkword is shown for a short time. If the password is correct, the correct codes are shown. If you enter the incorrect password, the checkword and the codes that are shown are also incorrect.

To open code memo for the first time

- 1. Scroll to *Extras*, **YES**, *Code memo*, **YES**. A message with instructions appears.
- 2. Press yes.
- Enter a four-digit password to open code memo and press YES.
- 4. Re-enter the new password to confirm.
- Enter a checkword (maximum 15 characters) and press YES.

The checkword can consist of both letters and numbers. To enter a number, press and hold the key.

To add a new code

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Code memo, YES.
- 2. Enter your password.
- 3. Select Add new code? and press YES.
- Enter a name associated with the code, for example, the name of the credit card company, and press YES.
- 5. Enter the code and press YES.

To open code memo

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Code memo, YES.
- Enter your password and press YES.
 Your entered checkword appears. When the decrypting process has finished, your codes are shown.

To delete a single code

- 1. Open code memo as described above.
- 2. Scroll to the code you want to delete and press *c*
- 3. Delete? appears. Press YES.

To edit a code

- 1. Open code memo as described above.
- 2. Scroll to the code you want to edit and press YES. Press YES again.
- 3. Select *Edit* and press **YES**.
- 4. Enter the name and press **YES**, enter the code and press **YES**.

Changing the password

- 1. Open code memo as described above.
- 2. Scroll to Options, YES, Chg password, YES.
- 3. Enter your new password and press YES.
- 4. Re-enter the new password and press YES.
- 5. Enter a checkword and press YES.

Forgot your password?

If you forget your password, just enter any password to access the code memo function. The checkword and codes that are then shown are incorrect. You must now reset the code memo.

To reset code memo

- 1. Scroll to Options, YES, Reset, YES.
- 2. Reset code memo? appears. Press yes.

Two voice lines

If your subscription supports the **Two line service**, your phone has two voice lines with different phone numbers. When you buy your phone, the names of the lines are normally line 1 and line 2, but you can change their names.

To change the name of a line

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Display, YES, Edit line tags, YES.
- 2. Select a line, YES.
- 3. Enter a new name, YES.

Changing lines

Once you have chosen a line, all outgoing calls are made on this line until you change it again. An icon indicates the line currently chosen for outgoing calls.



Note: *Incoming calls can be received on both lines, irrespective of the line currently chosen.*

To change phone lines

- 1. Scroll to Call info, YES, Next call, YES.
- 2. Select Switch to line 1 or Switch to line 2, YES.

Locking one line

You can choose to lock one of the lines, so that it cannot be used unless you enter the PIN2.

To lock a phone line

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Locks, YES.
- Select the phone line you want to lock: Lock line 1 or Lock line 2, YES.
- 3. Enter your PIN2, YES.

To unlock a phone line

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Locks, YES.
- 2. Select the phone line you want to unlock: *Unlock line 1* or *Unlock line 2*, YES.
- 3. Enter your PIN2, YES.

Calling card calls

When making international or long distance calls, you may want to use the calling card service to redirect the charges to a credit card account, instead of your normal account.

Note: You cannot use the calling card service when making a fax or a data call.

To turn on the calling card service

- Scroll to Phone book, YES, Options, YES, Set calling cards, YES.
- 2. Enter your phone lock code, **YES**. Select *On*, **YES**.

To save a card number

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Calling cards, YES.
- 2. Enter your phone lock code, YES.
- 3. Select Add new?, YES.
- 4. Enter the access number of the calling card server, **YES**.
- 5. Enter a name that you want to associate with your calling card server, YES.
- Enter the verification code of the calling card server, YES.

 Select which you want to send first – the number that you want to call or the verification code – and press YES to confirm your choice.

To edit a card number

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Calling cards, YES.
- 2. Scroll to the card number that you want to edit, YES.
- 3. Select *Edit* and edit the card number.
- 4. Press yes to confirm the new number.

Choosing a card

If you have saved two card numbers, you must choose which card you want to use before making a calling card call

To select a card

- 1. Scroll to Phone book, YES, Calling cards, YES.
- 2. Enter your phone lock code, YES.
- 3. Select the card that you want to use, YES.
- 4. Select Activate card, YES.

Making a calling card call

- 1. Enter the phone number you wish to call or retrieve it from the phone book by pressing and holding —.
- 2. Press and hold yes.

The access number of the calling card server is called. During the connecting phase, you are asked to send the phone number that you want to call and the verification code, in the order chosen earlier (see above).

Press YES when the display shows Send or wait a few seconds and the number and code are sent automatically.

Games

Your phone features a number of games.

To start a game

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Games, YES.
- 2. Select a game, YES.
- 3. Select New game or Resume game, YES.
- 4. Start the game.

To control the games, use the keys as follows:

Up = 2

Down = 8

Left = 4

Right = 6

Pause = C

Select/deselect = 5

Save and quit = **NO**

Confirm = YES

Undo = #

Reset = (*4)

Shoot or Rotate = 5

Extras

Alarm clock

To set an alarm

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Time, YES, Alarms, YES, Alarm, YES.
- 2. Enter the time and press **YES** to confirm your setting.

Note: Press any key to turn the alarm signal off when it rings. If you do not want the alarm to be repeated, press **YES**.

To set a recurrent alarm

- 1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Time, YES, Alarms, YES, Recurrent alarm, YES.
- 2. Enter the time and press **YES**.
- 3. Press *4 to select the days you want to recur. Press YES to exit the menu.

You can view the days in the *Recurrence rule* submenu.

To change the alarm signal

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Sounds & alerts, YES, Alarm signal, YES.
- 2. Select a signal, YES.

To run the stopwatch

1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Time, YES, Stopwatch, YES.

Press YES to start the stopwatch. Press YES again to stop it.

By pressing # when the stopwatch is running, you can save up to nine lap times. Press or to check your saved lap times.

To reset the stopwatch

• Press © when the stopwatch is not running.

To set the timer

1. Scroll to Extras, YES, Time, YES, Timer, YES.

Enter the hours, minutes and seconds and press YES.When the alert sounds, press any key to turn it off.

Calculator

The phone has a built-in calculator, which can add, subtract, divide and multiply.

• Press # to get +, -, x, /.

Press c to delete the figure to the left of the cursor.

• Press (*4) to enter a decimal point.

To use the calculator

In this example, we are going to divide 134 by 32.

- 1. Scroll to Extras. YES, Calculator, YES.
- 2. Enter 134.
- 3. Press # repeatedly until the division sign (/) appears.
- 4. Enter 32.
- 5. Press YES to get the answer.
- 6. To clear the display, press ©

Online services

Online services are customized services offered by network operators.

A SIM card which supports Online services works in the same way as a normal SIM card. When you have inserted your SIM card and turned on your phone, your network operator can download data to your SIM card. After the first data download and after restarting your phone, a new menu appears in your phone as the first submenu under the Extras menu

To enter your new menu system

• Scroll to Extras, YES, Online services, YES.

Note: This menu only appears if your SIM card supports this service. Some operators may not use the name **Online services**. Your phone may not support all of the services offered.

Your network operator can download new data, for example a new feature, to your SIM card. You may be notified by a message in your display.

Troubleshooting

Here are some problems that you might have while using your phone.

Error messages concerning the SIM card

Problems related to your SIM card can be corrected by contacting your network operator.

Other problems

No indication of charging

With an empty battery it can take up to 30 minutes for the charging icon to appear in the display. However the indicator light should be constantly lit.

Master reset

You can reset the phone's settings to the way they were when you bought your phone.

Reset the battery

Press and hold **NO** for 10 seconds to reset the battery. This is the same as disconnecting and re-connecting the battery if it were removable.

To reset the phone

- 1. Scroll to Settings, YES, Master reset, YES, Reset settings, YES.
- 2. Enter the phone lock code (0000) or the number you have changed it to. Press YES.

Number not permitted

The Fixed dialling function is on and the number you have dialled is not on your fixed numbers list.

Cannot access a certain function

The function or service may be dependent on your SIM card or the network. Contact your network operator.



Cannot receive any calls

- You may have diverted your incoming calls to another phone number.
- You may have set the *Accept Calls* option to *From no one* or *From list*. Select *From all*. You may have selected *Fax* or *Data* as the next incoming call.
- You may have GPRS only set for a data account. Select Automatic instead. Check with your network operator for more information.



Cannot speed dial

Your contacts are not saved on the SIM card.

Cannot access my contacts

Your contacts are not saved in the phone.

Msg waiting or memory full

Delete some old or saved messages as both the SIM card and phone memories are full.

Note: The Reset all option deletes all contacts, e-mail messages, text messages and WAP settings.

Important information

Guidelines for Safe and Efficient Use Please read this information before using your mobile phone.

Your mobile phone is a highly sophisticated electronic device. To get the most out of your mobile phone, please read this text about product care, and safe and efficient use.

Product Care

- Do not expose your product to liquid or moisture or to humidity.
- Do not expose your product to extreme high or low temperatures.
- Do not expose your product to lit candles, cigarettes, or cigars, or to open flames etc.
- Do not drop, throw or try to bend the product as rough treatment could damage it.
- Do not paint your product as the paint could obstruct the earpiece, microphone or any moveable parts and prevent normal use.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your product. The product does not contain consumer serviceable components. Only Sony Ericsson service partners should perform service.

- Do not use any accessories other than Ericsson or Sony Ericsson branded originals intended for use with your product (hereinafter referred to as "original accessories"). Use of non-original accessories may result in loss of performance, damage to the product, fire, electric shock or injury. The warranty does not cover product failures which have been caused by use of non-original accessories.
- Treat your product with care, keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Antenna Care

- Do not remove the antenna yourself. If your mobile phone's antenna is damaged, please take it to a Sony Ericsson Service Point or Certified Service Centre.
- Only use a Sony Ericsson original antenna that has been specifically designed for your mobile phone.
 Use of unauthorised antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the mobile phone and may violate the appropriate regulations, causing loss of performance and SAR levels above the recommended limits (see below).

Efficient Use

Only expose the mobile phone to temperatures between +55 °C (+131 °F) and -10 °C (+14 °F) when the mobile phone is in use.

For optimum performance with minimum power consumption please:

- Hold the mobile phone as you would any other telephone.
- Do not touch the antenna when the mobile phone is in use. Touching the antenna affects call quality, may cause the mobile phone to operate at a higher power level than needed and may shorten talk and standby times. Your phone has an internal antenna and can only be accessed by a Sony Ericsson Service Point or Certified Service Centre
- If your mobile phone is equipped with an infrared eye, never direct the infrared ray at anyone's eye and make sure that it does not disturb any other infrared units.

RADIO FREQUENCY (RF) EXPOSURE AND SAR

Your mobile phone is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it emits low levels of radio frequency energy (also known as radio waves or radio frequency fields). Governments around the world have adopted comprehensive international safety guidelines, developed by scientific organizations*, e.g. ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection), through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines establish permitted levels of radio wave exposure for the general population. All Ericsson mobile phone models are designed to operate within these stringent levels. The levels include a safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health, and to account for any variations in measurements.

The radio wave exposure guidelines employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. Tests for SAR are conducted using standardised methods with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all used frequency bands.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phone models, they are all designed to meet the relevant guidelines for exposure to radio waves. Variations in SAR below the radio frequency exposure guidelines do not mean that there are variations in safety.

SAR data information for residents in countries that have adopted the SAR limit recommended by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), which is 2 W/kg averaged over ten (10) gram of tissue (for example European Union, Japan, Brazil and New Zealand): The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested by Ericsson for use at the ear is 0.98 W/kg (10g). DRIVING

Please check if local laws and regulations, in the country/state where you are driving, restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Law in many countries/states requires drivers to use a Vehicle or Portable Hands Free solution. If so, it is recommended that you use only Ericsson or Sony Ericsson Hands Free solutions intended for use with this product.

Sony Ericsson is concerned about your safety. Always give full attention to driving and pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

RF energy may affect some electronic systems in motor vehicles such as car stereo, safety equipment etc. In addition, some vehicle manufacturers do not allow use of mobile phones in their vehicles, unless a hands free kit with an external antenna supports the installation. Check with your vehicle manufacturer's representative to be sure that your mobile phone will not affect the electronic systems in your vehicle.

Vehicles Equipped with an Air Bag

An air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including either installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment, for example equipment in hospitals and cars, is shielded from RF energy. However, certain electronic equipment is not, therefore:
